THOUGHT FOR YOUR PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

Just as some people are never more dangerous than the day after a defeat, others are never more vulnerable than the day after a victory. The day after Elijah defeated and demolished the priests of the Baal worshipers, Jezebel threatened to kill Elijah. The threat drove Elijah into hiding in a cave, where his vindictiveness and self-pity turned into what we moderns call a depression. But God does not leave us in caves. Often, if we would only recognize God in the still, small voice of calm, God brings us back into the light of the sun and Son by calling us to get up, look up and link up.

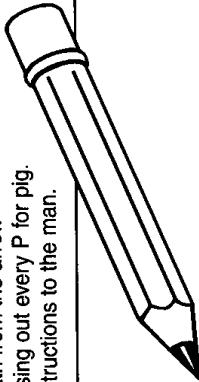

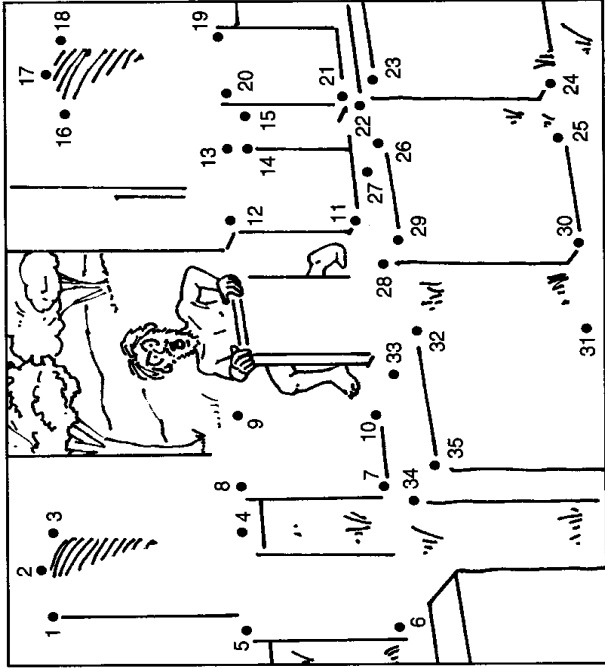

Jesus met a man who had been possessed by demons for a long time. He did not live in a house, but among the tombs.

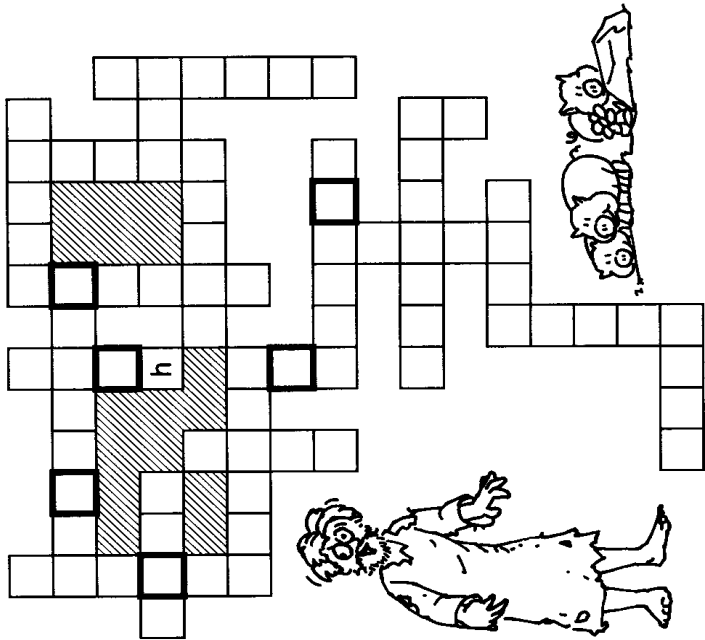
Connect the dots to complete the picture.
