


PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE AND THE LORD'S PRAYER

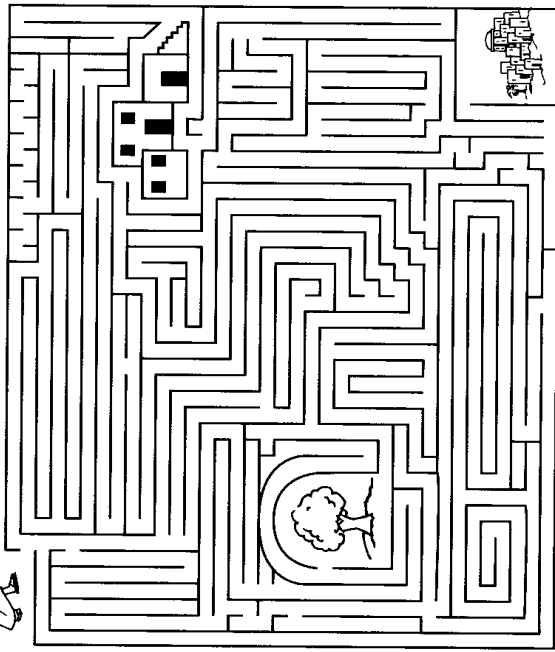
