What is the mission of First Pres Campus Ministry?

As a relational, student-led, intergenerational ministry, we meet university students wherever they are in their faith journey with Jesus Christ and encourage them to discover what God is up to in their lives and the life of the world.

How does the Campus Ministry Staff and Committee work to accomplish this mission?

1. Expand outreach to university students to clearly communicate the Gospel in their context. Campus Ministry is local mission, meaning we don't expect students to come to us or do things our way, but we go to where the students are, both physically and spiritually.
2. Come alongside university students to point them toward Christ and help them discover their spiritual and leadership gifts and the joy of Christian fellowship.
3. Develop and encourage intergenerational ministry and mentoring.
4. Bring the good news of our Campus Ministry to First Presbyterian members and friends, so our congregation's understanding of, commitment to, and excitement for this core local mission effort continues to expand.
