WHAT IS A FELLOWSHIP GROUP?

It is a group of 6-12 folks who meet about twice a month in homes or at church to study the Bible together, pray for one another and share their ideas, concerns, laughter, and sometimes, food! Through studying God's word together group members connect Biblical text with their lives. They build relationships with each other that stand the test of time and trials. Sometimes they go together to work at a service project. Sometimes they get together for a purely social activity like a game night or going to a concert together.

Read what participants in First Pres fellowship groups have to say about their experiences:

"Our fellowship group has allowed my faith to become an everyday reality with the support and friendship of people who live their faith. The value is priceless and a true gift from God."

"The fellowship group is a fun and enjoyable way to get connected with others in the church. We have thought-provoking conversations about our faith as we discuss the biblical texts. Our group is extremely diverse in terms of beliefs and backgrounds, and I believe that this diversity is what makes the group so special."

"Fellowship Group is important to me because it reflects the Christian life here on earth. These people are like family, are best friends, and are walking the walk that helps keep me focused."

"Through my own thinking and through others' sharing, fellowship group gives me the opportunity to let the word of God nourish and question me about my present faith, attitude, relationships, etc. in a very respectful, warm, trusting and supportive atmosphere."

"The more I engage with it, the more the Word becomes wonderfully alive."

"As we have reached out to each other to share the joys and sorrows of births and deaths, marriages and divorces, recovering health and life-threatening sickness - and we have attempted to make sense of these experiences in the light of reading God's Word together - we have felt God's hand working in His world and in all of our lives in very special ways."

HOW IS THE FELLOWSHIP GROUP MINISTRY RUN AT FIRST PRES?

Last year, there were six fellowship groups started at First Pres, involving 65 participants. We hope to add new groups every year to help us grow in faith and fellowship. Each group is facilitated by trained lay leaders, and the curriculum is chosen by the group, with the help of the facilitators. Groups meet at a time and place chosen by the group itself.

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN BEING PART OF A FELLOWSHIP GROUP?
