Anti-Racist Pedagogy with the Rev. Dr. Kristin Riegel. Our guest preacher the Rev. Today at 11 a.m., she will lead a conversation about her work, offering a synopsis of her research, helping us think about how whiteness shows up in the way Presbyterians talk, think, and teach about the Bible, and prompting conversation about practices churches can engage to take a different approach.
