


CALL TO CONFESSION





Advent Paper-lace Banners were designed by liturgical artist Ellen Phillips and were cut by members of First Pres. Ellen says: "The designing of banners is more than an art commission; it is a spiritual discipline that begins with the scriptures. The scriptures for this first week are dark, even sorrowful.

Isaiah 64:5 wonders how we can even be saved...we have all become unclean...like filthy rags. Yet, there is still hope that the Messiah will come, and that the darkness will fade. My design for this banner is minimal and unclear. The only thing that can be identified are the rays of a slowly rising sun, a sure sign that the light will shine."

The chancel flowers are given in loving memory of Lewis and Maxine Profit and in loving memory of Jackie Voss by her husband Burt, and in honor of Burt's 95th birthday.
