HOLY WEEK WORSHIP

Palm Sunday worship is April 9, at 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 a.m. There will be a Palm Parade at the beginning of the 9:30 a.m. service. Children will meet Debbie MacVey in the Social Hall ten minutes before the service. The 9:30 a.m. service will include special musical leadership by the children and youth.
